OPEN ENROLLMENT CHARTER SCHOOLS

305 statutory cap (by 2019)

Employment "at-will"

No minimum salary scale for teachers

Locally proscribed student code of conduct

No authority to levy property taxes

Not eligible for certain state funding opportunities; some facilities funding started in 2018

Services contracts pre-approved by TEA

Some real properties tax exempt

Three strikes of poor financial or academic rating triggers mandatory closure

SAME

Academic accountability: State AEIS system & Federal ESSA

Financial accountability

Teacher retirement system

Immunity from tort

Required to have open meetings

Subject to open records

Mandatory board training

State curriculum & graduation

PEIMS reporting

Criminal history background checks

Required to disclose conflicts of interests

Ban on nepotism

TRADITIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS

More than 1,000 districts

Employment contracts

Minimum salary scale for teachers

Statutorily proscribed student code of conduct

Authority to levy property taxes

Eligible for more state funding opportunities; facilities funding subsidized by state or local tax

Services contracts approved solely by school board

All real properties tax exempt

No automatic closure triggers in place for poor academic or financial performance
